

2001 - 2002 SFC Indoor Postal Program

INTERNATIONAL RIFLE

Rules: All matches in this competition will be carried out in accordance with I.S.S.F. Rules. General and technical rule books for Free Rifle and Air Rifle as well as targets are available from the Shooting Federation of Canada.

Targets: Securing the proper targets and competing on a range of the correct length is your responsibility. Targets must be fired in the presence of two (2) witnesses and signed by both. Witnesses must be known and acceptable by the club officer. You or anyone else may score your targets, (plug gauge inserted only once) or they may be returned unscored. Targets used in this program are:

50 ft. ranges	NRA #A-36
20 yd. ranges	SFC #134
10 m. ranges	SFC #104 (Air Rifle)

Classification: There are four (4) classes: Master, Expert, Sharpshooter and Marksman in all events. Any shooter holding a current SFC classification will be placed in their class. Any shooter NOT having a valid classification will be in the Temporary Master class. A junior's score may be classed as Marksman at the Chairman's discretion.

Class Awards: will be based on the number of entries in each event. Champion winners cannot also win a class award in the same event.

One to four entries	first place only
five to eight entries	first and second places
nine or more entries	first, second and third

Junior Shooters: may shoot in regular class events, in addition to, or in place of, the junior events. Only the desired matches listed on the entry form, and the appropriate fees paid, is all that is required. Juniors must be under twenty-one (21) by December 31, 2001, in accordance with I.S.S.F. Rules for all events.

Matches for Club Teams:

1. There is no restriction on classification.
2. There will be separate matches for prone and 3-position teams.
3. Participants must be members of a club affiliated with the SFC or the DCRA.
4. A club may enter any number of teams in each category without having to pay the administration fee. Individuals may shoot on only one prone team and/or one 3-position team.
5. A team will consist of four (4) shooters. It is not necessary to identify team members when making the initial

entry, but once a shooter has begun a set of targets, no substitutes will be allowed.

6. Courses of fire:
Prone
Sixty (60) shots per team member
3-Position
Twenty (20) shots per team member - Prone
Twenty (20) shots per team member - Standing
Twenty (20) shots per team member - Kneeling
7. I.S.S.F. Match Rifle and Air Rifle rules apply.
8. Scores fired in team matches will be entered on individual classification records.

Compulsory SFC Administration Fees:

For: Full senior SFC or DCRA member	\$7
Full junior SFC or DCRA member	\$5
Non member of either SFC or DCRA	\$18

Members of clubs affiliated with the SFC or DCRA do NOT have to be members of either SFC or DCRA to compete in individual team matches. **HOWEVER - Individual SFC membership is required to receive SFC classifications.**

Whenever possible, clubs should have one person co-ordinate all their entries to economize on mailing costs.

Firing Date: There is no closing date for entries, however, the closing date for returned targets is MAY 31, 2002.
